

Sexual Harassment at Terranea

The second speaker described the issues

associated with Terranea that have resulted in 3 lawsuits (LA Times Dec 27, 2017). One of

these lawsuits involved Sandra Pesqueda who was fired for reporting sexual harassment and assault. Sandra's bravery in coming forward as a "Silence Breaker" resulted in her being named one of Time Magazine's 2017 Persons of the Year. Now



petitions are being circulated to put an initiative on the November ballot that demands solutions to these and other problems at both Terranea and Trump Golf Course (LA Times Feb 26, 2018).

Candidate for LA County Superior Court Office No. 67

Our inspiring third speaker found herself in the foster care system at the age of 10, and though she was shuffled between homes, she eventually found enough stability in a long-term placement that allowed her to focus Judge Lucy Armendariz, on her education and gain admittance into Court Judge Candidate UCLA. After completing UC Hastings School of

Law, she worked as Chief of Staff for then State Senate Majority Leader Gloria Romero. Now, **Judge Lucy Armendariz** already has a decade of experience in a judicial position on the State Bar Court, where she hears cases involving attorney misdeeds. Currently running for Los Angeles County Superior Court Office No. 67, she received unanimous endorsement from the I ACDP.

Another unanimous endorsement by LACDP went to Alex Villanueva, who is running for LA County Sheriff against incumbent Jim McDonnell. Villanueva served in the Air Force and then worked for the Sheriff's Department (for 32 years) and simultaneously the National Guard and somehow managed

to earn a Doctorate in Public Administration along the way! As a union organizer, he challenged corruption in the ranks, and both he and his wife (also a LA County Deputy Sheriff) received pushback from Lee Baca as well as Don Tanaka, both of whom are now in prison. Since Villanueva has not seen the improvements needed in the department during McDonnell's tenure (which is currently 1000 deputies understaffed) and since McDonnell is opposed to SB 54, California's sanctuary state bill, Villanueva tossed his hat into the ring. The last time a Democrat was elected to LA County Sheriff's highest position was in the 1870's!

Charlie vs Goliath Documentary

The documentary *Charlie vs Goliath* portrays the immense difficulties involved in making progressive inroads in the very red state of Wyoming (the last time a Democrat was elected Senator there was in 1964!). Although this state has only a half a million people in total, they still have two Senators, just like California and New York do, but these states have many, many, many more people. So, in fact, the people of Wyoming have a disproportionate influence in

our national government.

Using the "Impossible Dream" song from the play based on Don Quixote's Man of La Mancha as his theme, retired priest Charlie Hardy made the astonishing decision to run against well-entrenched, well-funded (primarily by Big Oil) Republican incumbent Mike Enzi. Charlie came to the decision to do something bold after having spent many years working to help the poor in the slums of Venezuela, only to return home to the richest country in the world and find similar conditions for the



poorest segments of US society. In keeping with his social, economic and political justice reform platform, Charlie refused any special interest donations, and thus his was the most financially lopsided race in the country at that time. What's the Scoop on WBMWD's Desalination Plan?

West Basin Municipal Water District "has spent more than 15 years and an estimated \$63 million dollars researching desalination as a drought-proof source of drinking water for a region stretching from Malibu to the Palos Verdes Peninsula. If approved by West Basin's board of elected directors and a variety of regulatory agencies, the \$380 million dollar facility would be the first full-scale desalination plant in Los Angeles County, turning 20 million gallons of seawater a day into drinking water. Another 40 million gallons a day could be sold to other agencies. The local project would provide approximately 11 percent of West Basin's water demand. Operation of the plant could begin in 2023 and would be built on the site of the El Segundo Generating Station along Vista del Mar on the border of Manhattan Beach."

There has however, been environmental opposition to this project. Bruce Reznik, executive director of L.A. Waterkeeper, opposes the West Basin's plan for the following reasons: "all the 'build' alternatives are confined to ocean desalination. The EIR completely neglects other options, including conservation, expanding wastewater purification, storm water capture and infiltration, and even brackish groundwater desalination," he said. "These options are climate-friendly, less expensive, and more equitable — and they meet most of the basic project objectives."

Residents of the area are strongly encouraged to attend the next public input session, which will be held at Richmond Street Elementary School in El Segundo on May 12 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The public comment period for the draft EIR started on March 27 and continues through May 25, 2018 at 5 p.m. The report is available at westbasin.org/desal. You may submit comments at one of the meetings, online, by emailing desaleir@westbasin.org or by hand-delivery to the West Basin Municipal Water District office (17140 S. Avalon Blvd., Carson, CA 90746).

In addition West Basin is providing interactive lunch & learn sessions. Enjoy a
