PV League of Women Voters Explain the **November 8th Propositions**

Confused about the vast array of propositions on the November 8 ballot? We are, too. Looking at the list, one sees an education bond, a Medi-Cal funding measure, a vanity measure put forward by a right-wing multimillionaire, a measure to give special interests new powers to block legislative action, an extension of the millionaires tax to fund education, a cigarette tax to fund healthcare, an advisory vote on Citizens United, two death penalty acts, a drug price relief act, an adult film measure, a marijuana act, and on and on and on.

If you think this system of legislating by ballot box has hit critical mass, you are correct. Luckily, we have the PV League of Women Voters to explain the measures to us and to add some clarity to a confusing situation. The League studied the ins and outs of the various measures so you and I don't have to, saving us uncounted hours of our precious time.

As you know, the League is a nonpartisan group that works to ensure voters have access to the ballot box and are informed about candidates and issues. This year they will be conducting a candidate forum on Thursday, October 6 at Hesse Park in RPV at 7 pm. If you miss that one, they will be conducting another at Toyota Hall in the Torrance civic center. The candidates for US Representative and for the 66th Assembly District will answer questions submitted by the public.

So, please come to our meeting on October 16th, at the Peninsula Center Library. Come at 2pm to network and enjoy our homemade goodies. The program will start at 2:30 pm. See you there.

mass atrocities, including the Holocaust, and teach these lessons to their students in order to create a more tolerant, educated, and peaceful future. Defining genocide as the deliberate and systematic extermination of a national, racial, political, or cultural group, Leys went on to list the gradual precursors as follows:

- 1. Classification of peoples (i.e. Tutsis vs Hutus)
- 2. Symbolization of peoples (i.e. "Mexicans as rapists")
 - 3. Discrimination
 - 4. Dehumanization
 - 5. Denial of past genocide

PV Dem Club President Lynn Bommer noted that many of Trump's remarks could apply to this

Leys gave Rwanda as an example of the success of such a program. Now run by Rwandans, the Genocide Prevention Program was begun by EIHR and patterned after lessons learned in the aftermath of the Holocaust. During the first year of instruction, teachers work on curriculum, and in the second and final year of training, teachers attend workshops on how to incorporate this

into their teaching. In the USA, teaching about genocide begins in the 8th grade.

The genocide in Cambodia by the Khmer Rouge resulted in a loss of 20% of the population. Even after the genocide, active land mines have killed 20 thousand more. Although Cambodia and Rwanda are just a couple of the areas in which EIHR is working, Leys suggested viewing the 2014 award-wining documentary "Watchers of the Sky" (available on Netflix).

The Genocide and Atrocities Prevention Act of 2016 (s.2551) was Introduced in February 2016 by Democratic Senator Ben Cardin, but not yet voted on. It would establish a U.S. policy to regard the prevention of mass atrocities and genocide as a core national security interest and a core moral responsibility. This bill is supported by Senators Boxer and Warren.

Superior Court Judge Seat 42 Candidate

We had already heard from Alicia Molina, one of 2 Democrats running for seat 42 of the Superior Court, so we invited the other Democrat in the race, Efrain Matthew Aceves to come speak to us. Also a UCLA undergrad and Law



School grad, Aceves is Superior Court Judge the only Democrat in this Seat 42 Candidate race rated Well Qualified

by the LA Bar Association. His early years were as an immigrant and one of 7 children, and the only one of his siblings to finish college. The majority of his more than 100 jury trials as a prosecutor were waged against crimes

perpetrated against women and children. He has served three terms on the Whittier City School District school board, and currently serves as president. He is endorsed by the LA County District Attorney, Jackie Lacey and State Assembly Speaker, Anthony Rendon, the LA Times and various labor unions. His website is http://www.acevesforjudge.com.



It was created by political cartoonist, Paul Conrad, winner of 3 Pulitzer prizes, in a career that lasted 5 decades. As chief editorial cartoonist for a fairly conservative Los Angeles Times, Conrad pushed the envelope for a more liberal perspective. He addressed the social justice issues of the day—poverty in America, movements for civil rights, the Vietnam War, the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, as well as corporate and political corruption. During his Presidency, Conrad's cartoons often made fun of Ronald Reagan, prompting Nancy to complain to owner Otis Chandler. As a point of pride, Conrad appeared on Nixon's famous Enemies List, yet ironically was chosen as the Richard Nixon Lecture Chair at Whittier College, Nixon's alma
