February General Meeting

On February 19, the Palos Verdes Democrats will meet at 2:30 pm in the community room of the Peninsula Center Library to hear from two speakers of interest to Democrats.

Steve Goldsmith, Operations Facilitator with Mediators Beyond Borders International, a NGO working with partners internationally in war-torn countries to build mediation skills and assist these countries in working towards a more "peaceable" world. MBB places special emphasis on enhancing skills of women peacebuilders in conflict zones. Additionally, Mediators Beyond Borders is an official observer organization for the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, advocating for strengthening mediation structures in the UN.

MBB also has local chapters, which have trained many dialog facilitators to assist in "communitypolice dialogs" throughout LA County organized The chapter is by partner organizations. developing, along with the international organization, "purple" dialogs (between Democrats and Republicans) to address the "conflict of politics and the politics of conflict".

Steve Goldsmith is a graduate of the University of Chicago who began his career as an activist in the civil rights and peace movements of the

> 1960's. In the last 25 years, he has worked with an organization that provides "restorative justice" mediation programs for keeping inner city kids on a success track. Steve's interest and involvement in peace and conflict resolution spans more than 50 years.

> Our second speaker is UCLA Law professor, Jonathan Zasloff. Zasloff earned a JD from Yale and a PhD from Harvard (History of American Foreign


Policy). As if that were not enough, he is now a rabbinical student! He teaches Torts, Land Use, Environmental Law, Comparative Urban Planning Law, Legal History, and Public Policy Clinic - Land Use, the Environment and Local Government

Zasloff has concerns about the President's choice for ambassador to Israel, which he sees as a strategy to split the American Jewish community. And he has concerns about the President's general "hostility toward democracy." As an example Zasloff points to the President's early statements about banning immigrants based upon religion.

regarding the Southern Poverty Law Center. This non-profit organization is a legal advocacy group that specializes in civil rights and public interest litigation. They put together a map of the 892 active hate groups, showing that every state in the continental US has at least one. The southern states have the most, but California has the most of all the western states. including white nationalists, anti-Muslims, anti-LGBTs, anti-immigrants, white separatists, black separatists, the KKK, neo-nazis and holocaust denial groups, just to name a few. The SPLC teaches tolerance by providing anti-bias documentary films, books, lesson plans and other materials that reduce prejudice and promote educational equity. According to their website, "the SPLC is dedicated to fighting hate and bigotry and to seeking justice for the most vulnerable members of our society. Using litigation, education, and other forms of advocacy, the SPLC works toward the day when the ideals of equal justice and equal opportunity will be a reality." Our PV Dems board voted to donate \$100.00 to this worthy organization. Thank you Evelyn for educating all of us!

Kanji Sahara of the Gardena Valley Democratic Club also has taken positive steps in the wake of the Nov election by proposing that the Dem clubs in the South Bay area join forces to focus on the following:

- Support for Muslims
- Support for undocumented individuals facing deportation
- Opposition to Paul Ryan's Congress
- Opposition to biased Supreme Court nominees

As a child, Kanji was incarcerated in a WWII Japanese Camp and he is committed to prevent

Former PV Democrats
President **Tony Hale**provided a defense of
Genetically Modified
Organisms (GMOs),
especially surprising
since he is widely
regarded as an advocate

for the environment, and most of us feel that environmentalists are not in favor of GMOs. We previously heard from Jim Montgomery, who spoke in opposition to GMOs, so Tony's presentation enabled us to hear both sides. Stating that scientific consensus is what brought him to favor GMOs, Tony used a scrolling background of pro-GMO references to make that point.

Tony noted that natural horizontal gene transfer gave us the sweet potato and natural evolution of cabbage gave us 9 common edible plants, but it wasn't until 1982 that the first plant (tobacco) was genetically modified. Tony stated that the "Green Revolution", which involves agribusiness-type pesticide/herbicide monoculture farming using GMOs has saved over 1 billion people from starvation. Now globally, 81% of soybeans, 81% of cotton, 35% of maize and 30% of canola are genetically modified, and the US numbers are considerably higher. He cited Monsanto (now, or soon-tobe Bayer) as the developer of Golden Rice, which has increased levels of β-kerotene, thus enriching the diets of many in Asia.

During the spirited Q & A session, when asked about some commonly criticized chemicals, Tony stated that glycophosphate

(the principal ingredient in Round Up) is less toxic than caffeine. He claimed that Bee colony collapse is due primarily to poor commercial practices rather than due to chemicals and that the decline of the Monarch butterfly is primarily due to loss of habitat. Tony stated that "there are no credible studies showing that GMOs are unsafe" and the World Health Organization finds GMOS have no negative effects on human health.

Since so many in the audience had differences of opinions on this presentation, the PV Democrats have invited Tony to begin a blog on our website regarding GMOs. This will give those who would like to counter Tony's presentation a chance to research facts.
