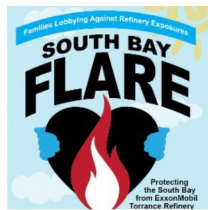

Torrance Refining Company and Valero Wilmington refinery use Modified Hydrofluoric Acid (MHF). Hydrofluoric Acid is highly toxic and volatile. MHF is Hydrofluoric Acid with additives.

If a significant amount of Modified Hydrofluoric Acid (MHF) is accidentally released, a ground hugging cloud of MHF could form and drift for miles.

Those exposed would be terrorized, choked, their eyes and lungs seared.

Many could suffer serious injuries, such as internal organ damage, or die.

Three years ago, an explosion at the Torrance refinery caused an 80,000 lb chunk to blast off and crash just a few feet from a tank containing 50,000 lb toxic and volatile MHF.
